May Not Fix Derby Roof

The \$4,000 to \$5,000 job of replacing slipping marble roof chips on the sloping portion of the Derby junior high school roof will probably be "functional" and not just decorative, school officials say.

"I've been told they reflect light and thus help keep the roof from drying out," Dr. Richard Featherstone, administrative assistant to the superintendent of schools said. He said a check will be made to determine the function of the roof covering.

While the present condition of roof is "unsightly," he said, "if they are there just for decoration I don't intend to worry about it any further unless the board of education does."

The board has received a letter from its attorney, John E. Martz, saying that architects in charge of the original construction cannot legally be held responsible for failure of the roof covering to stand up.

So long as an architect exercises the "care and skill of those ordinarily skilled in the profession" there is no implied promise that miscalculations may not occur," Martz said.

Featherstone said that the basic roof is in good condition and that only the covering material has broken down.

Reader Raps Removal of Political Signs

To the Editor:

It is interesting to note the petty tactics and thoughtlessness with which proponents of certain political candidates do battle and the considerate attitude and fair play evidenced by others.

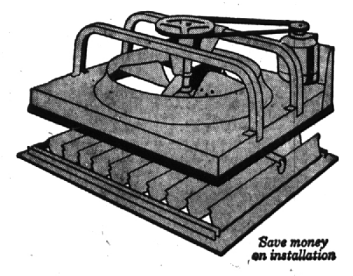
