# Cranbrook Speaker's From Cranbrook, Kent

CRANBROOK—The Very Rev. R. S. G. Bradshaw, Vicar of Cranbrook, Kent county, England, will give the Baccalaureate service for Cranbrook and Kingswood school seniors at Christ Church Cranbrook, June 5.

Rev. Bradshaw is on exchange as Priest-in-charge, St. John's church, Medina, N.Y.

THE SIX Cranbrook institutions in Bloomfield Hills are named for the "founder" in England, where Rev. Bradshaw has been Vicar since 1947.

Henry Wood Booth, father of Founder George G. Booth, emigrated to this country from the Kentish village more than a century ago.

The name was then applied to the Bloomfield homes of a George and Ellen Booth when they acquired the land in 1904.

Rev. Bradshaw's visit will not be the first exchange between the two areas. In 1933 Headmaster C. Russell Scott of Cranbrook school in Kent visited Michigan's Cranbrook and presented the boys' school with a plaque, a replica of the charter granted to the first Cranbrook school by Queen Elizabeth in the 16th century. The school in England also has a plaque sent from Cranbrook school here.

REV. BRADSHAW is a governor of the school. He is also a governor of Cranbrook secondary school for Boys and the Mary Sheafe secondary school for Girls.

He serves as chairman of the managers of St. Dunstan's and Colliers Green primary schools and is one of three honorary chaplains of the College of St. Nicholas of the Royal School of Church Music.
