**Hills Home Damaged By Fire**

A gas-fed fire caused an undetermined amount of damage to a home under construction in Bloomfield Hills last Friday afternoon.

The ranch type home, located at 101 Cranbrook road, was under construction by Walter H. DeSimples & Sons, 231 Briggs Building, Birmingham, when a backhoe digger being used in the backyard pulled a gas line loose in the home. The workman called the Bloomfield Hills Fire department to report that gas was escaping and were ordered to evacuate the area.

BEFORE HILLS POLICE and firemen arrived at the scene, another call came in, this time reporting that a fire had started in the basement of the home.

Robert Stadler, public safety director, then put into effect the box alarm, which is a cooperative deal whereby fire equipment from surrounding areas also answered the fire.

Within five minutes there were three pieces of fire fighting equipment at the scene, one from the Bloomfield Hills and two from other communities.

COMMUNITIES participating in the box-o alliance are: Bloomfield Hill, Bloomfield township, Bloomfield Village, Troy and Cranbrook Foundation.

Stadler said the "speed and efficiency" in which the Bloomfield shows the true value of such an operation.

**1st Presbyterians Greet Moderator From Mexico**

Phro. Dr. David Macias, moderator of the national Presbyterian church of Mexico, visited the First Presbyterian church, Birmingham, last Sunday.

At all three morning worship services, Dr. Macias gave the scripture reading and the benedictions in Spanish. He followed this with a prayer and message for the congregation.

Dr. W. Glen Harris, pastor of the church and a Spanish student, translated the message.

A few additional lines added spontaneously by the moderator surprised Dr. Harris but he arose to the occasion.

DR. MACIAS' surprise visit followed his attendance at the general assembly of the United Presbyterian church in the USA that was held last week in Cleveland. In the summer of 1959, Dr. Harris visited many missions and churches of the Presbyterian church in Mexico and has a keen interest in the development of Presbyterianism in that area.
