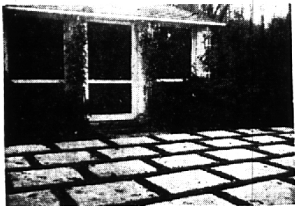

Police Spike Run Of Liquor Pools, Free (?) Fiftths'

Sixty-four bottles of free liquor may cost participants in a "liquor pool" a \$1,000 fine or two years in jail under state law.

The newest in chain letter angles is flourishing in the Detroit and suburban areas, according to authorities. The practice is illegal under a law prohibiting any use of the mails to promote a lottery. When conducted by phone, the pools are still illegal under state lottery laws.

THE CHAINS work in this way: participants are invited to purchase a free-fifth for the person at the top of the list and add their own name at the bottom. The lure of bottles of liquor is the bait. Lt. Robert Storch of the Birmingham police stated, "the first guy on the chain is going to make a killing, but the last guy is going to get stuck. The pools are strictly illegal."

Meanwhile, some Birmingham area residents were boasting about collecting 20 or more free bottles of liquor from the pools.

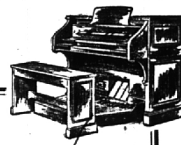

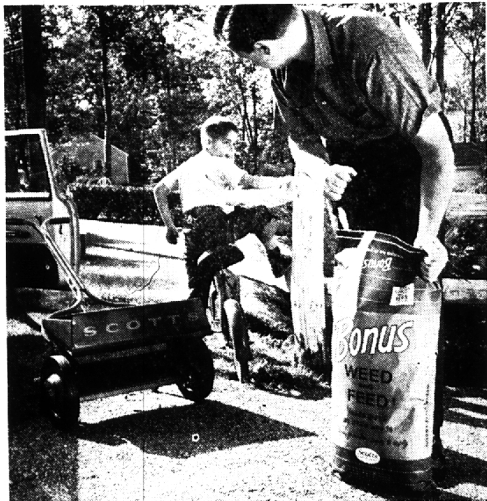
