Medical Mirror



Foods and Dreams
• Fever Convulsions
• Kidney Stones

Q. Why do some foods—like cheese—make people dream?
A. So far as can be determined, there is no scientific evidence that cheese or any other food causes dreams.

Q. What causes convulsions in some children when they run a slight fever? Is there any medication to prevent fever convulsions?
A. I enjoy reading Medical Mirror very much and find it helpful. — A faithful reader.

Q. Some type of brain disorder is present in the majority of children who have fever convulsions. In almost half the cases there is a family history of similar convulsions, indicating a hereditary trend. Medical studies show that a convulsion is a serious symptom in childhood and deserves careful medical investigation. The physician may or may not prescribe drugs, depending upon the final diagnosis.
Q. Is there any way to remove kidney stones other than by surgery?

A. Doctors have been searching for years for a way to remove kidney stones without surgery. Nothing very promising has turned up. Several things make it difficult to find a satisfactory dissolving agent for kidney stones. For one thing, the stones are not all of the same chemical composition so that what dissolves one won't touch another. Secondly, it is difficult to find a solvent or dissolving solution that is not irritating to bladder and kidney tissues. Some progress is being made but at the moment surgery is about the only way to remove stones that are too large to be passed.
