"The Study of Prehistoric Man and His Environment in Michigan" will be the subject of a talk by Dr. James B. Griffin, director, museum of anthropology at the University of Michigan, when the American association of university women meets June 8.

The group will assemble at 12:30 p.m. for lunch and a tour of exhibits at the Institute of Science-Cranbrook.

DR. GRIFFIN has been extensively engaged in field work and will tell of his findings. His excursions have taken him to the area around Athens, Pa., Dearborn County, Indiana; the Central Mississippi Valley, Central Mexico, Illinois and Missouri, Colorado, Texas, New Mexico and Arizona.

Dr. Griffin is the author of "Archaeological Survey in the Lower Mississippi Alluvial Valley 1940-47" and "Archaeology of Eastern United States" as well as numerous articles in professional journals. He was the recipient of the Viking fund medal and award in Anthropology for 1957.

Dr. Griffin will be introduced by Mrs. Edward W. McCull.

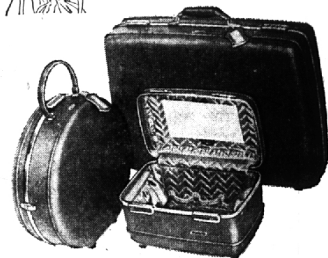

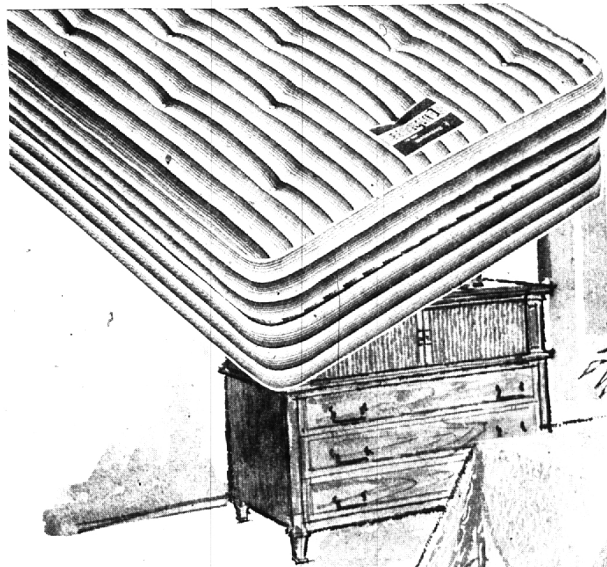
