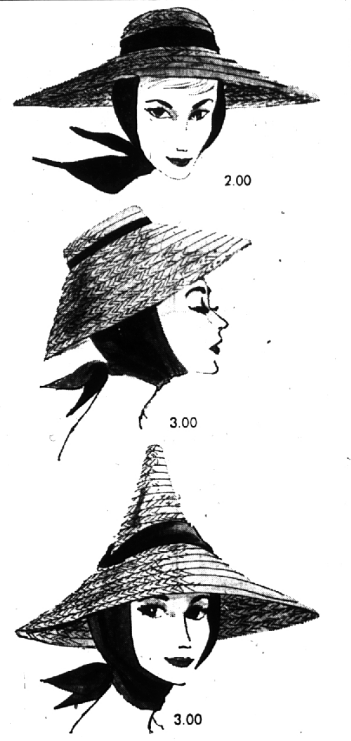


## Troth Revealed At Dinner Party

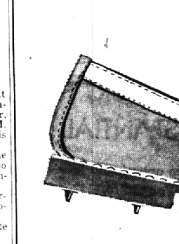


## Parents Announce Daughter's Troth
