Cranbrook Music Guild Slates Summer Festival

Cranbrook Music Guild has scheduled an ambitious program for its Cranbrook Gardens Summer festival, including outdoor concerts by a choral group, a ballet troupe and a jazz unit.

Departing from its previous policy of presenting only chamber music concerts on the beautiful grounds at Cranbrook, the Guild has announced intentions to "present the best in all fields of art."

THREE MAJOR events will be offered to members of the Cranbrook Music Guild and to the general public starting with a concert by the Michigan Choral, an internationally-known 100-voice mixed ensemble on June 26.

Their appearance will be followed July 10 by a joint concert featuring the Severo Ballet and 25 members of the Detroit symphony orchestra under the direction of Valtor Poole.

BOTH OF THESE concerts will be held in the outdoor Greek theatre at Cranbrook. The Guild's boldest experiment under its new policy will be presentation of the Dave Brubeck Quartet, one of the world's finest jazz units, in the Cranbrook stadium July 17. This event will close out the summer festival.

James Schroder, chairman of the summer festival, said the decision of his group to diversify its concerts "sprang from a desire to open the beautifully scenic facilities at Cranbrook to lovers of all types of good music and patrons of other fields of art."

SCHNEIDER emphasized that the concerts are open to the general public.
