New 200-Home Subdivision Gets Okay in B'field

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP—A set of rules and regulations, applying to both active and reserve members of Bloomfield township fire department, were adopted Monday by the township board.

Other board business transacted included acceptance of Franklin Woods Manor water system as a part of the township water department and approval of a 200-home subdivision, Sherwood Hills Estates, to be located at Telegraph and Square Lake roads.

THE BOARD passed resolutions three and four for construction of 3,100 lineal feet of sanitary sewer on Old Mill road and Chula Vista lane, denying a petition of Chula Lane residents to be omitted from the district. July 11 at 7:30 p.m. was set for a second hearing on the sewer development.

Cost of the project is estimated at \$25,200, apportioned at \$975 a lot.

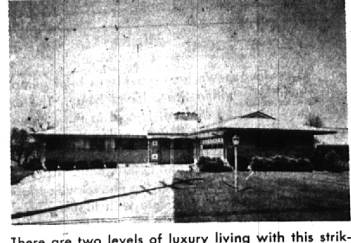
