## Beverly Hills Expects To Set Sewer Hearing

BEVERLY HILLS—By Monday night Beverly Hills Assessor Howard Palmer is expected to have the individual charges to home owners established on the village's big annual sewer project.

Once the fees are figured, the village council can set a hearing date on the spread of the costs on the basis tentatively set for 8 p.m. June 30.

The estimated cost of the huge sewer project for the village's eastern

western half is \$628,000. The amount includes \$145,000 for mains and pumping stations, plus \$483,475 for the lateral lines leading from them.

THE \$525,475 cost is being financed through 20 special assessment districts, involving 697 property owners. Deep lots along Lahar road, whose owners had asked to be excluded from sharing in costs, are included.


A general obligation bond issue will finance the \$145,000 cost of mains. The project connects the entire area to the new Evergreen interceptor sewer.
