Cranbrook's Horse Show

CRANBROOK — While horses from this area and other areas are cavorting at the Bloomfield Open Hunt Horse show this week, a quiet but colorful group of horses from around the world has been gathered for a special Horse Show exhibit in the museum of Cranbrook Institute of Science, labeled "The Artist's Horse."

Indian ponies, sacred horses, mounts of Rajas and hobby horses are part of the show.

SOME HORSES are temple pieces of wood, some are of brass, others are on beaded vests, in baskets, woven into belts, painted on playing cards, in gaudy applique on a San Blas blouse. A god's horse from Java is part of a great a Yugoslavian fiddle. Fossil horses are also shown, from the tiny four-toed, cat-sized Eohippus, or "dawn horse" to later types.

The horses on exhibit are from the collections of Robert T. and Suzannah B. Hatt, George C. Valliant, Gertrude Kirkpatrick, Mrs. Marcus W. Cunningham, Charles Machelski, J. M. Johnson, Milford G. Chandler, Eugene Power, and the collections of the Institute. The show opened on June 21 and will continue for two weeks.

million drain along 8 Mile. The hearing is slated for 8 p.m. July 19 at Southfield high school.

THE SAME hearing was scheduled last April, but county Drain Commissioner Daniel W. Barry postponed it indefinitely at the request of the City of Southfield, which wanted the drain commission to investigate a purportedly cheaper plan to build the drain along 8 1/2 Mile road.

Richards blasted Southfield Wednesday for its inaction up to now. "Southfield is the city that will benefit, and they are causing all of our problems," Richard said. "I told them you can't please all of the people. But they're a new city and they have to learn how to get things done."

SWANSON said Wednesday that he personally would favor an arrangement where the city at large paid half the cost, and the drainage district paid the other half. He said he did not know if Southfield's council would go along with the proposal.

Richards wants assurance from the county that no small group such as the Southfield property owners will stall the drain further. Its construction was first proposed nearly 10 years ago, after Northland and other new subdivisions and Oak Park building began pouring waters across Eight Mile road.

Richards' demand for an "iron-clad" guarantee from the board of supervisors would be impossible to grant, according to the county's corporation counsel.

"THE BOARD cannot give a guarantee on something over which it has no control," Barnard said. "The drain was established under a state act setting up a controlling board. It consists of the chairman of the Oakland supervisors, board of auditors and drain commission."

The question, Richards raises, will be considered," Barnard said. "But there is a limit to what we can do."

BARNARD said the county has a valid contract with Detroit for the treatment of sewage from the new interchanges. "We would be prepared to take it to court," Barnard said.

Barnard speculated that an agreement could be worked out whereby Southfield would agree to pay its share of the South-Oak drain cost, then determine later whether to raise the money by assessment against property owners or the city at large.

"THE DRAINAGE board has been doing everything in its power to move this along," Barnard said. "We have got to work these things out with Detroit on a friendly basis. We can't be battling with water, bond issues and sewage involved, this thing has too many implications."

Before the July 19 hearing in Southfield, Drain Commissioner Barry expects to have an independent engineering firm's opinion on whether the 8 1/2 Mile alternative would be feasible. Swanson blames the current delay on the drain commission's failure to reach a conclusion on the 8 1/2 Mile proposal before now.

Meanwhile, Birmingham, parts of Bloomfield Township and other communities north of 14 Mile road—which have been using a Birmingham sewage disposal plant for treatment—are prepared to continue using it a little longer.

THE PLANT had been scheduled on July 1 to be turned back to Birmingham by the Oakland county department of public works, builders of the interchanges.

Southfield is under pressure from the state highway department to get going on the South-Oak drain. The department threatens to withdraw its nearly \$1 million participation in the drain and find other means for draining Eight Mile road unless the South-Oak gets underway immediately.
