Immediately following the service will be a fellowship hour so members can become better acquainted with the others in the church.

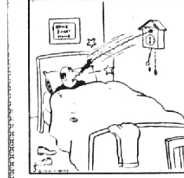
**To Talk June 26 At First Baptist**

Q. What is the caloric content of "low-calorie" ice cream?  
 A. According to an editorial in a widely read medical journal, the caloric content of special ice creams is not too different from that of ordinary ice cream. Synthetically sweetened ice cream has 176 calories per serving. Special ice cream for reducing diets and for diabetes has 133 calories per serving.

Q. Will you please explain the term "low-calorie" ice cream?  
 A. Our guess is that the reader is referring to some condition involving both kidneys which makes frequent trips to the bathroom necessary. Pyelonephritis (note spelling) is, of course, a definite and meaningful medical term. Simply stated, pyelonephritis means infection of the kidney. The germs that cause the trouble may reach the kidney during the course of a blood stream infection or as a result of obstruction of the urinary system. Symptoms of pyelonephritis include chills, fever, vomiting, and sweating. There may be severe pain and tenderness or merely a dull ache in the kidney region. Most early kidney infections can be successfully treated with drugs.

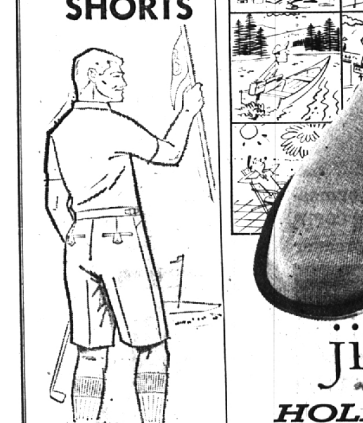
