Lots 29, 30, 31, 36, 37 and 38 East Maple Gardens Subdivision. Lots 29, 30 and 31 are zoned R-4 Multiple Family Residence. These lots have a 225 foot frontage on the north side of Maple west of Coolidge and they have a depth of 141.80 feet.
