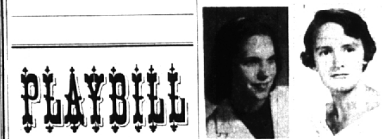

Medical Mirror
WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT

INTERNAL PROTECTION

- Low Forehead
- Stained Teeth

Q. What is the medical opinion regarding the use of vaginal tampons and especially their use during swimming?

A. This is a rather delicate subject that might be answered individually. For a brief discussion of this subject, write to SCIENCE EDITORS.

Q. I have a very low forehead. Is there any way to raise the hairline by permanently removing the low-growing hair?

A. Regardless of where unwanted hair is situated, there is only one method of permanent removal and that is by destruction of the hair with the electric needle. On the lips and chin the results are fairly good although some scarring may result. On the forehead, where the skin is quite smooth and tightly drawn over the skull bone, any degree of scarring might be very noticeable. This would be the chief drawback. However, you should be guided by your doctor's advice on this matter.

Q. I have been told that multiple-vitamin products cause staining of teeth in children. Would you have any information about this?

A. There seems to be no medical reports that mention staining of teeth by such products. It is very hard to stain tooth enamel although some discoloration may result from use of iron preparations. All children should, of course, visit a dentist regularly. If you have any unusual condition, such as tooth discoloration should be discussed with him at that time.
