Members of the Birmingham Council of Churches elected new officers for 1960-61 at their June meeting. President is The Rev. Donald G. Zill, pastor of Beautiful Saviour Lutheran church.

Vice president is the Rev. Roy Pitts, pastor of Beverly Hills Baptist, secretary, the Rev. Raymond A. Fenner, pastor of the Congregational church of Birmingham and treasurer, the Rev. Donald Pennell, pastor of First Presbyterian church of Troy.

THE COUNCIL, composed of all ministers in the Birmingham area, meets the second Tuesday of each month for breakfast and a program at one of the churches. The council is an extension of the Detroit Council of Churches, and seeks by its program, to draw Protestant churches into a cooperative fellowship.

Mrs. Lovejoy has been active in the religious education division of the Detroit conference and has taught courses in the churchmanship school.

THE LOVEJOYS, who will move to Birmingham today, have a daughter, Darven G., a graduate of Albion, now a camp counselor in Vermont. She will teach school in Lansing this fall.

Rev. Lovejoy will be the fourth minister on the staff of First Methodist associated with Dr. Arnold F. Runkel, Dr. H. O. Martin and the Rev. Robert F. Falk. He comes to Birmingham from Milford.

North Church To Hear Famed British Preacher

Dr. Albert D. Belden, minister emeritus of Pilgrim Fathers' memorial church, London, England, will be the guest preacher at North Congregational church, Birmingham, on the morning service of worship at 11 on Sundays, July 3, 10 and 17.

Dr. Belden, an internationally famous preacher and author, is in his 60th year of service as a Congregational minister. He has served with distinction in three pastorates, Banbury, Crowston, Westcliff-on-sea and Whitefield's Central Mission, London, and is the author of many books for adults and for children, including "The Inner Struggle of George Whitefield," and "Pax Christi," a new plan for the church concerning war.

HE WAS A PIONEER in London of the psychological religious approach to personal and social problems, and is religious columnist for Manchester Evening News. He has paid seven visits for preaching and lecturing to the United States and Canada, and was twice received by President Roosevelt at the White House.
