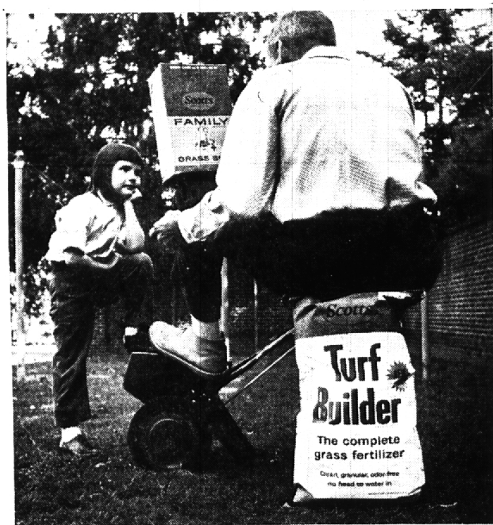

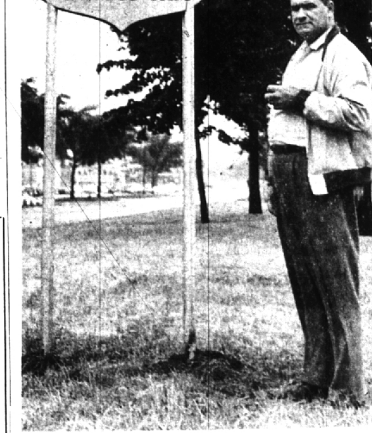

The garden represented at least 150 feet of perennials. The total property has a pleasing design and after moving into their home the Sherwoods have had many hours planning their plots as well as plant selection. Their shrubs are so placed that you have a sick passageway through behind evergreens which are placed out into the lawn area so that the path is wide. It gives a welcome view that does not afford a complete vision from one yard to another due to the opening.

AT THE rear of the large lot opposite their important windows and porch they have a wide raised patio suggested by a placement of ledgers to look about three layers high. This detail gives a delightful effect with its balanced placement of the plantings and gives the observer a peaceful reaction to the design.

Plan on an easy curve (not too busy) and perhaps a peninsula out into the lawn area with an evergreen at its tip to assure winter interest. Don't plan on plant selection within the margin of the rocks and the boundary plantings unless the selection will not mean lots of upkeep. Remember that daisies are wonderful to embellish a distant view, also the large phlox will play a good role for this purpose.
