## Ballots End Up Heavy, Despite Many Changes

Some intentions changed and some prospective names dropped from Oakland county election ballots before the recent final filing date. Despite the changes, a big list of legislative and judicial candidates will face Birmingham-Bloomfield and Southfield area voters at the Aug. 2 primary.

Latest change was the announcement by Huntington Woods Mayor David R. Calhoun that he was dropping out of the race for state senator from Oakland county.

His move leaves the senate race open to fourth district Rep. Farrell E. Roberts (R), who now has only one opponent for the Republican party nomination. He is Richard D. Kuhn, of Waterford township.

IT WAS incumbent Senator L. Harvey Lodge's decision not to seek re-election that prompted Roberts' entry into the senate race. Lodge is one of eight candidates for the new Oakland county probate judgeship which he helped to create.

Stanley M. Brown, a Bloomfield township resident, switched his candidacy from the senate to third district representative on the Republican side of the ballot. Brown said at the time, "I do not want to run against my friend Farrell Roberts."

The name of Seaholm high school teacher Edward J. Vandertan disappeared from the list of democratic candidates seeking to oppose Republican incumbent Congressman William S. Broomfield.

The prosecuting attorney's office has a duty to protect the consumer and the legitimate businessman by vigorous prosecution of those who commit fraud by devious business operation. Birmingham attorney George J. Fulkerson declared Monday night June 20.

Fulkerson, a candidate for the Democratic nomination for prosecuting attorney of Oakland County, spoke at a dinner meeting of the Holy Kinnis club at the "Daire Dyrne."

Fulkerson cited a scheme whereby the householder is sold a cheap, sub-standard brand of carpet, deliberately trade-marked to sound like a famous old-line brand on the proposition that the carpeting will be his free if he refers enough prospects to the salesman. He pays a big price for the carpet relative to its quality.

## Detroit Wants Military Research In Universities

Joseph Kadana, a Detroit runner for Congress in Oakland county wants the military to get out of the research business.

The 47-year-old lawyer and college lecturer said the function of a university is to provide a study and teaching center for the arts and sciences and that military research and development belongs in the university.

"The function of the military forces," said Kadana, "is to gain the earliest possible victory in war. Putting research back in the university will not only result in the saving of vast expenditures, but it will also expedite developments in various programs of research."

Kadana is running in the 18th district under the provision of that law which allows a resident of the state to seek election to Congress anywhere in Michigan.
