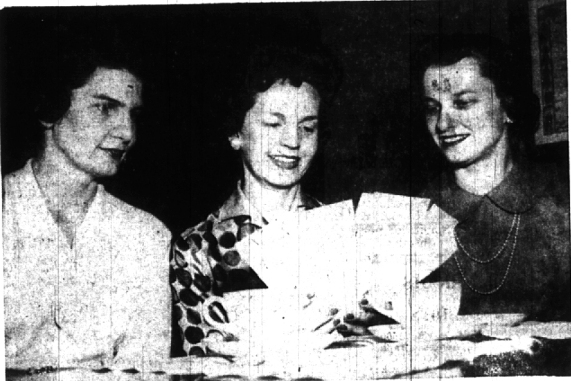

By unanimous vote, the Senate instructed Lodge and his committee on waste to continue through 1960.
