TO TRANSFER a registration from one address to another WITHIN THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, send a signed request to the office of the City Clerk stating present address, former address, and date of moving to present address. Such transfer may be made any time up to and including Monday, March 7, 1960, at 8:00 P.M.

1st Presbyterian Names New Education Minister

The Rev. Jack W. Angerman is the new minister of Christian education at the First Presbyterian church. He succeeds The Rev. Robert W. Gibson, Jr.

Mr. Angerman is a graduate of Ohio State university and the Western Theological Seminary, Pittsburgh.

He has served as pastor of the Cross Creek Presbyterian church, Cross Creek, Pa., First Presbyterian church in New Philadelphia, Ohio, and since 1953 has been associate pastor in charge of Christian Education at Chevy Chase Presbyterian church, Wash., D. C.

While there he served in presbytery and synod affairs with special activity in the area of Christian education.

HE HOLDS memberships in the National association of directors of Christian education, The United Presbyterian Church, U.S.A., the directors section of the National Council of Churches, the Adult Education association of the U.S.A., The National Recreation Association.

As Minister in charge of Christian education of the Birmingham church, he will be in charge of the program for more than 1800 children through the ages of one through 15 as it centers in the church school program and of more than 400 youths who are part of the Westminster fellowship program of the church.
