Chapters of eight national sororities at Denison university, Granville, Ohio, have initiated 173 women students. A minimum requirement is required of pledges to qualify for initiation.

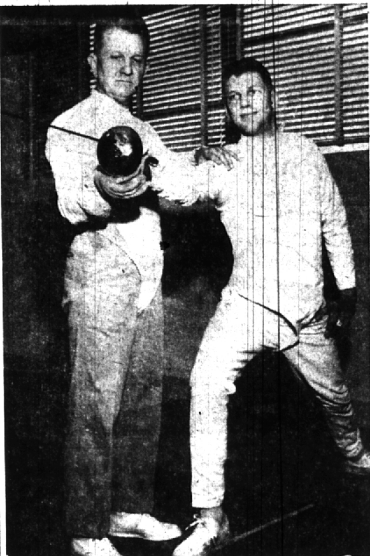

STATE PARKS AND RECREATION

Rules and Regulations Pursuant to the authority vested in the Commission of Conservation by the provisions of Act No. 17, Public Acts of 1921, as amended, the following rules and regulations are hereby adopted concerning the use of all lands administered by or under the control of the Department of Conservation within the state parks and recreation areas. It shall be unlawful:

- 1. To enter upon or occupy state-owned lands for any purpose when said lands are closed to public use, use or occupancy, as determined by the Department of Conservation.

OUTDOOR ITCH. Along about now you and I have just about had it with winter—and we're itching to get out to do some work around the yard or in the garden. Now, the natural and traditional way to satisfy an itch is to scratch, but it's too early to go scratching around in the yard. Lawns should not be raked, mulch should not be removed from roses, shrubs, evergreens, or perennials. The garden should not yet be spaded. So, how do we cure our itch? How about getting ready to START SEEDS INDOORS? This form of indoor gardening is simple, easy, inexpensive, and can be very rewarding. Right now is the time to do your planning and get the things you will need and want while both your mind and our store are not cluttered up with fertilizer, pre-emergent crabgrass control, and grass seed.

Annuals, generally, should be started indoors about six to eight weeks before they are to be set out. Seeds started in late March are ready to be transplanted outdoors in late May. These include cosmos, asters, snapdragons, salpiglossis, zinnias, verbenas, ageratums, salvias, scabiosa, nicotiana, stock, and petunias. Seeds germinate best in a material like TERRALITE which may spread in a layer over sterile POTTING SOIL, which you have put in a PERMANENT TRAY, in JACK POT peat pots, or in a MOISTRITE seed starter tray. Do not use ordinary garden soil unless you sterilize it by baking in the oven at 300° for 30 to 45 minutes, or you may be surprised at the little beasties you are hatching—furthermore, your seedlings will damp off.

FERRY'S and MANDEVILLE-KING seeds are on display now and NORTHRUP-KING seeds will be as soon as the railroad finds them. The selection is good and you can take your time picking out a particular packet. If you want something pre-planted try a FERRY'S SEED STARTER or a NORTHRUP-KING PUNCH-N-GRO. These are available with either flower or vegetable seeds already placed in an excellent starting medium—all you do is add water and jump luck. The seedlings may later be transferred to a planter tray or flat for additional growth and hardening. Your annual garden can be in bloom weeks earlier if you start your seeds indoors.
