University of Michigan's President at AAUW Meet

"What Is Most Needed in Education Today" will be discussed by Dr. Harlan Hatcher, president of the University of Michigan, when he speaks before the American association of University women at their monthly luncheon in the Birmingham community house March 9.

An able speaker and an eminent educator, Dr. Hatcher has not only the management of a great university including the various graduate schools but he also has problems similar to those of most parents, that of rearing a teenage son and daughter.

MRS. HATCHER will accompany Dr. Hatcher, and those attending the luncheon will have the opportunity of meeting them personally at 12:15.

Mrs. Hatcher is known as a gracious hostess. It is said that she probably entertains more people in her home each month than any other hostess in the state, since she holds her home open to students and faculty often.

DR. HATCHER speaks frequently before civic and educational groups. He was the leader of a group of American and Canadian educators that made a 15,000 mile tour of Russia in the spring of 1959, studying their educational system.

He has stated that, "America must match Russian efforts in higher education if this country is to maintain its economic and political independence."

EDUCATED at Ohio State university, earning his Ph.D. in 1927, Dr. Hatcher began as an instructor of English at Ohio State and became vice president. In 1951 he came to U of M as

president. He is the author of several books and an authority on the history of Ohio and the Great Lakes. He is a Phi Beta Kappa and has honorary degrees from several universities.

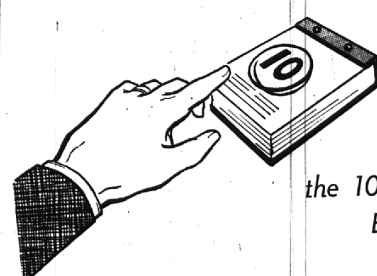
