**'Business Needs
The Individual'
—GM's Gordon**

Education and business must encourage the individuality of man if we are to retain the tremendous advantages of a free society, President John F. Gordon of General Motors declared Saturday.

"We need to instill in our upcoming generations a keen awareness of their importance as individuals, a sharper urgency to develop their individuality, a stronger motivation toward learning and a greater willingness to work."

"THE FREEDOMS of which we are prone to speak so often and which do indeed give us a tremendous advantage," he said, "but we can retain this advantage only so long as we remain firm in our belief in the transcendent importance of man as a unique individual."

The GM president, who lives in Bloomfield Hills, spoke at a meeting of outstanding college and secondary school educators who gathered in Detroit to select more than 100 winners of General Motors four-year college scholarships.

Gordon told the educators that business is now being wrongly accused of putting "a premium on conformity" — of submerging the individual by insisting that all conform to a single pattern of approved behavior.

"The facts . . . are just the contrary to these myths," he declared. "The great need in business is for individuality. Business recognizes the importance of making it possible for employees to develop themselves, think for themselves and acquire intellectual independence."

He said the young man entering business today has a far greater opportunity to express his individuality, and be more important as an individual, than ever before.

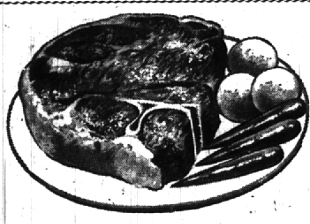

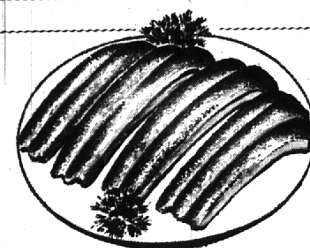

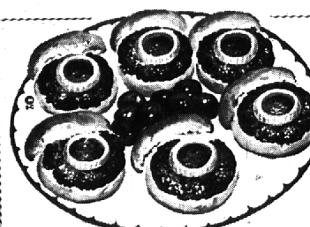
