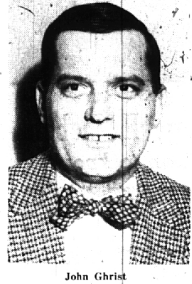

2. For the qualified electors and PROPERTY OWNERS ONLY IN THE VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS, to vote on the following proposition:

"Shall the Village of Beverly Hills, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding One Hundred Forty Thousand (\$140,000.00) Dollars and issue its general obligation bonds therefor for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring and constructing additions and improvements to the sanitary sewer from the Rouge River at Lahser Road to the intersection of Eastlady and Westlady Drives and from 13 Mile Road North generally along the line of the Rouge River to 2500 feet North of 13 Mile Road, two pumping stations with necessary force main and a force main gravity outfall sewer line in Lahser Road from a point 1420 feet South of the Rouge River to 12 Mile Road, together with necessary appurtenances and attachments?"

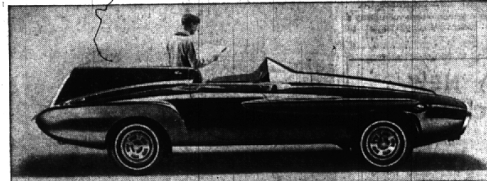

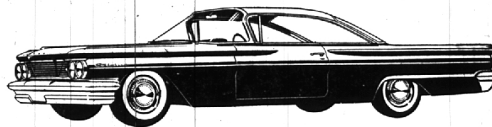
