Because all junior highs have, or will be, studying Martin Luther, the showing of this film comes at an opportune time.

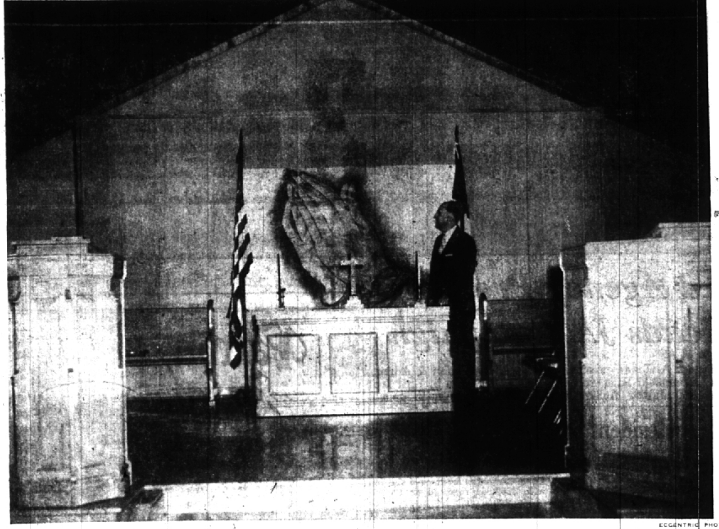
A free will offering will be taken to cover the cost of the film. Light refreshments will be served after the movie.
