**Leopold Simoneau Appears At OC Community Concert**

The last concert in the Community concert series for this season will be March 16 at 8:15 P. M. in the Oak Park high school auditorium. Leopold Simoneau, Canadian lyric tenor, will present a solo recital. Due to serious illness, his wife, Pierrette Alarie, coloratura soprano, will not appear with him as originally scheduled.

Mr. Simoneau is a truly international artist. He is a leading tenor of the Vienna state opera, Milan's La Scala, the Teatro Colon in Buenos Aires, the Paris grand opera, the Munich state opera, and the Chicago Lyric opera.

Each year he graces the great international music festivals in Edinburgh, Salzburg, Glyndebourne, Montreal and Toronto. He has appeared as soloist with the world's finest orchestras under such conductors as Bruno Walter, Sir Thomas Beecham, Charles Munch and many others.

Individuality has always characterized Leopold Simoneau. His name is now synonymous with superb tenor lyricism throughout the world, and he has been likened by critics to the great tenors of many lands: Italy's Tito Schipa; Germany's Richard Taubert; France's Edmond Clement; and the great Irish-American tenor, John McCormack.

Plattered though he is by these comparisons, Leopold Simoneau prefers to remain uniquely Leopold Simoneau — to the constant benefit and delight of music lovers throughout the world.

At first his public singing was confined to Montreal's St. Patrick's cathedral where he was soloist in the choir. But at the age of 17 he participated in an Offenbach operetta at his alma mater, Laval university, which whetted his appetite for the musical stage. His first professional appearance came a few years later when he sang on a Montreal radio station and received the magnificent sum of \$3,000.
