"Higher School Taxes—Now and Later" will be the topic of a panel discussion on school district revenues at the March 16 meeting of the Pierce PTA.

Joseph R. Root, secretary of the Birmingham board of education, will discuss the need for higher teachers' salaries and more teachers for the school district. This will be part of an explanation regarding the support of the Board for the proposed 4-1/2 mill tax increase to be decided in the March 28 election.

The role of Oakland County in distributing tax revenues to the school districts will be presented by Daniel Murphy, county clerk. Particular attention will be given to the board of allocations' legal discretion to increase the county's portion of the school district's tax millage.
