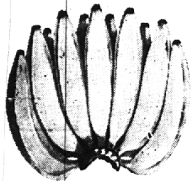

In Oakland County . . . Dems Seek

Moore: Use Patients' Pensions

Congress Candidate

Telling state senators how he thinks additional money could be raised for the care of the mentally ill, Oakland county probate Judge Arthur E. Moore said this week in Lansing that social security payments to patients in state hospitals should be taken by the state. As much as \$1 million in federal money could be raised this way, and used to pay costs of care, he said. He testified in this way on a bill to assure hospitalization to mentally ill children now on waiting lists. Judge Moore said another \$1 million could be raised annually through private hospitalization insurance if average costs of care

were't determined unrealistically by the state. THE STATE could collect as much as \$14 per day for 30 days for psychiatric care of patients covered by Blue Cross-Blue Shield, however, only the state's current average cost of \$4.80 per day can be collected from insurance companies, the judge said. The child priority bill was introduced in the state senate by Oakland county Republican Senator L. Harvey Lodge. It was worked out by Judge Moore and the state probate judges' association.

Democrats are seeking a strong candidate to run against 15th District Congressman William Broomfield in November. The Oakland county party leaders, apprehensive about the vote-getting abilities of the two announced candidates, seek a candidate with a bigger name and wealth of political savvy to bankrupt Broomfield's strong accounting with county voters. Behind the scenes, the party has been turned down by Mrs. Dorothy Kemp Roosevelt, 292 Greenwood, Birmingham. The sister-in-law of FDR made an unsuccessful bid for Congress 18 years ago. Also approached by the Democrats was James C. Allen, Southfield's attorney and former Birmingham mayor, of 1168 W. Maple, Birmingham. Southfield Mayor Donald L. Swanson, Michigan State Fair manager, also declined to run.

School Head Foresees Federal Aid

With many Oakland county school superintendents as well as national teacher groups advocating federal aid to education, Oakland county school Superintendent William J. Emerson said this week he has a personal feeling that we're going to have federal aid in one form or another. Emerson said he knows of no county school superintendent opposed to federal aid. Supporters of federal aid are especially concerned with lack of buildings and classrooms in the nation. They cite an estimated shortage of 132,400 public elementary and secondary school classrooms.

OAKLAND county is in a better position than most areas, Emerson said, because "we have an aware citizenry who for ten years have been voting taxes and supporting education." "This does not hold true for the rest of the country in general."

Ferndale Move Starts Pressure On 12 Town Suit

A request for the state to hurry a decision on the Madison Heights-Twelve Town drain case will be discussed tomorrow in Lansing with Attorney General Paul L. Adams.

Representatives of the cities of Royal Oak, Berkley, Huntington Woods and Oak Park will probably attend the session, along with state health officials.

Ferndale started the move to get health officials to ask Adams to speed a state supreme court decision on the case. If the Twelve Town drain authority's appeal to the Supreme Court follows normal channels, the decision would be in August at the earliest.

NO ACTION can be taken on 12 Town drain construction until the decision is handed down. Madison Heights won a ruling from Oakland circuit Judge William John Beer in its fight to get its 12 Town assessment lowered. Judge Beer said the 12 Town did not show that it considered Madison Heights' contribution to the need for the big \$47 million drain when setting that city's share of the cost. Twelve Town officials appealed.

Democrats To Endorse Administrator

The Oakland county Democratic committee will hold its quarterly precinct delegates meeting March 14 at 8 p.m. in the Metropolitan club hall, W. Nine mile and Livernois, Ferndale.

Guest speakers are Thomas Quimby, Democratic national committeeman; Bill S. Farman, co-chairman State Central Committee and Alfred Mock, an official of the state highway department.

On the business agenda will be the committee's official endorsement for the appointment of a new Public Administrator, a post recently vacated by Jack Moskowitz of Huntington Woods. Seeking the job are attorneys Lawrence Best, Royal Oak; James Ginn, Southfield; and James Allen, Birmingham.

Committee endorsement is tantamount to being appointed. Attorney General Paul L. Adams will confirm the actual appointment. Democratic Party workers will initiate a unified county-wide census drive in precinct strongholds beginning with the city of Pontiac. Party members from all over the 18th district will band together for a search for Democratic voters this week.

County Planners To Get Report On DPW Program

The facts behind the organization and program of the Oakland county department of public works will be the central theme of the March 10 annual meeting of the county planning commissioners of Southeastern Michigan. Planning commissioners from seven counties will gather at the student center at MSI-Oakland to hear first hand the program and progress of the DPW from Delos Hamlin, chairman of the Oakland county board of supervisors and R. J. Alexander, director of the

Oakland county department of public works. Not only the beginnings of the public works program will be discussed, but how Oakland county has integrated its public works projects with the planning efforts of the Oakland county planning commission. J. Robert F. Swanson, chairman of the commission, will chair this annual meeting. It is anticipated that some 60 or more county planning commissioners will attend.

FIRST TO announce his candidacy for Congress was Edward J. Troy, 29-year-old Seaholm high

school teacher, Zigmond J. Niparko soon followed Vanderman into the ring. Niparko, 40, of Hazel Park, has run for Congress five times, never got beyond the primaries.
