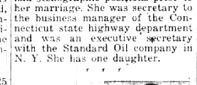
Father of four children, he is a member of the Franklin Community association and was chairman of the architectural board for LaMesa subdivision.

ROBERT E. WINKEL, 42, 25761 Franklin Hills drive, incumbent treasurer, has lived in Franklin

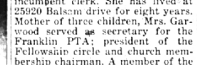
