

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:
In the initial pruning of newly planted rose bushes, how far above the buds should the cuts be made?

BOB'S ANSWER:
Cut about a quarter inch above the buds and try to make your cuts above buds which are on the outside of the stems. The new growth will then be outward rather than in toward the center of your plant.
