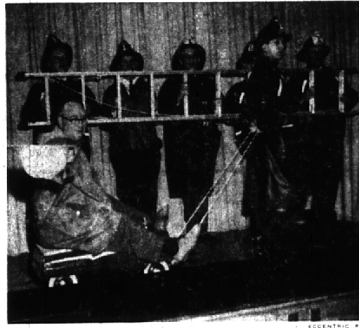
The Carnival will be a later date than usual this year and the hours have been changed. June 4 is the date with hours from 11 p.m. to 4 p.m.

## Dinner-Dance Set May 20 for Foxcroft

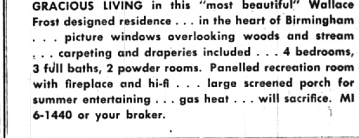

## Women Voters League Nearly Official in S'field

**SOUTHFIELD**—A provisional Southfield branch of the League of Women Voters will be formally organized March 31 at a meeting in the auditorium of the Reynolds Aluminum company building at Northwestern Highway and Northland drive.

The League is a national non-partisan organization that promotes political responsibility through informed and active participation of citizens in government—and in political parties.

It does not support or oppose any political party or candidate and none of its board members may work actively in their political parties. It works for or against governmental issues or measures in accordance with a position reached independently of any partisan interest on the basis of study and discussion.

**IN MICHIGAN**, where the League has 3,500 members, its most publicized stand supports constitutional revision, one of the most significant areas of League activity in many states in the last 20 years.

Permanent registration of voters, civil service reform and support of aid to mothers and children are other areas in which the 40-year-old state League has implemented policies of the national organization.

The Michigan League is the first state league to undertake a state-wide study of metropolitan area problems, currently underway.

On the national level, evaluation of United States foreign policy, emphasizing support of foreign economic aid, and a study of national water resources development are the items of current interest.

**THE BEST-KNOWN** of the League's public informational activities is the Voters' Service, which publishes and distributes "Voters' Guides". These present nonpartisan factual information about candidates, issues and voting procedures before elections. The process of obtaining information about our representative government and parties is a year round job, carried out by stationing observers at meetings of legislatures, city councils, boards of education and similar groups.

"Know Your State", a publication analogous to the "Know Your Town" project which will be the Southfield League's main activity as a provisional group, was published in 1957.

**LEGISLATORS**, candidates and office holders of all political hues, and on the local, state and national governmental levels throughout the country, are familiar with the flood of letters and testimony from League members when developments occur in matters on which the organization has taken a stand.

According to an Escanaba paper in October 1947, League attitudes and procedures inspired an admiring state legislator to say, "first they educate themselves on an issue and then they educate the voters and they end up educating the legislators."

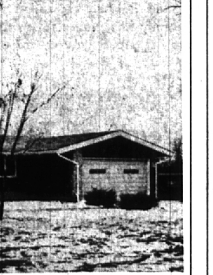

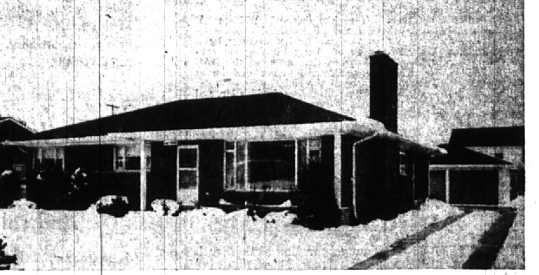
