Eleanor Ravitz, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Ravitz, is "doing well and behaving like an angel," according to her mother. The youngster is at Mt. Carmel hospital.

The vaporizer was apparently overturned, her mother said, when the child turned in her sleep tangling her hand in the cord of the ironing board.

The hospital run was the first in the village's new ambulance department, recently by Simon Knudsen of neighboring Bingham Farms.

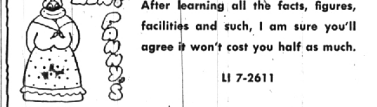
Have You Met . . .

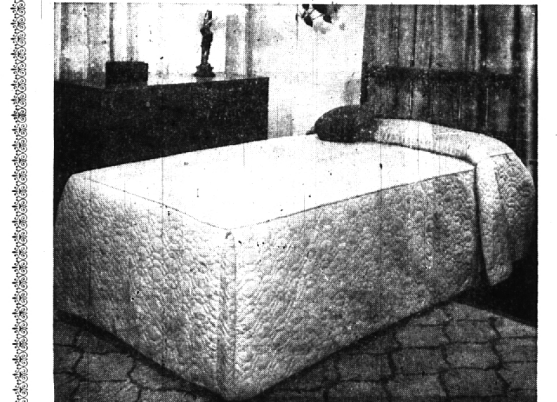

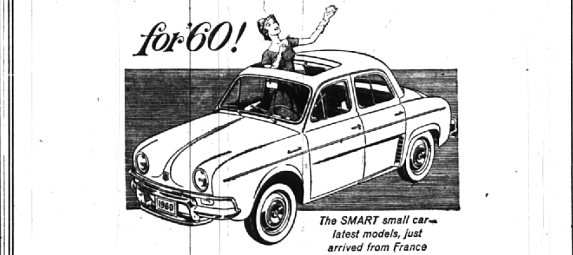
