

Pension Plan Proposed For Beverly Hills PSD

BEVERLY HILLS—A pension plan was tentatively approved for the Beverly Hills public safety department, and two proposed business developments were considered by the village council at its Monday meeting.

The pension plan, estimated to cost the village approximately \$5,000 next year if it is adopted, will be outlined to the public safety department to obtain the men's

reaction before further council consideration.

Upon retirement at 55, the plan would pay a \$200 monthly pension to a 30-year man who earned an average salary of \$5,400.

The plan was one of three retirement systems tailored for the village by the actuarial firm of A. C. Gabriel.

THE PLAN provides "a shade" more than cities like Birmingham and Royal Oak, Councilman Ted Shurtleff said in outlining it. But it is less than Southfield and Ferndale.

Shurtleff said the plan was designed "to keep the high caliber of men you have to have in a combined fire and police operation."

Real estate woman Kathleen Madonia submitted a request for rezoning of residential property on the west side of Southfield road near Beverly. She seeks B-1, non-retail business, and B-2, retail business, zoning for the property. With the request she submitted architect's plans for a proposed contemporary structure to house a bank at the site.

The request was referred to the planning board.

THE COUNCIL also moved to allow Harold Weiss, of Detroit, to investigate ways to obtain water and sewer facilities for his property on 13 Mile just west of Greenfield, which he proposes to develop for business purposes.

In other business, the council approved an extension of the village's contract with the Southeast Oakland county water authority to 1995, subject to the authority's permission to allow emergency use of three Artesian wells in the village.

The council received newly-elected Mrs. Fannie Adams' resignation as village treasurer, and moved to accept it following selection of a new treasurer. Councilman Chester F. Guilmet was named to head a committee he formerly directed in a search for a new village treasurer.
