### Keep Trying-You May Save a Life

● Asthma Cures  
Q. Is it possible to reverse an accident or drowning victim of asphyxiation?  
A. Even though you can not feel the pulse in the victim of an accident, drowning, electrocution or poisoning, it may not mean that death has taken place. Doctors have resuscitated "brought back to life" many patients in whom the heart beat couldn't be detected. Heart action and breathing rarely cease at the same time. It is only after three or four minutes left in which successful resuscitation is possible. Even after this point every effort should be made to revive the victim by applying measures to restore breathing and heart action.

Q. Are doctors any closer to a cure for asthma than they were ten years ago?  
A. The basic principles of cure have long been known, but it is sometimes hard to come by. Asthma is due to inflammation of the breathing tubes, which tend to contract and become covered with

## In Oakland County... Judge Souris Hits Apathy Toward Court

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — Speaking at the home of C. Allen Harlan, 3535 N. Adams, Bloomfield Township, Michigan's newest State Court justice last week criticized citizen apathy regarding the state judicial system.

Judge Theodore Souris said his Bloomfield Democratic club audience was an example. When only a few of the 60 club members present could name four of the eight Michigan supreme court justices, he told them, "You ought to be ashamed."

The judiciary, he emphasized, is the office that will determine how far legislators or the governor can go in welfare and other programs.

SOCIOLOGICAL beliefs, not strict party lines, motivate Michigan's supreme court justices, he said. He labeled the law as that which separates the human from the beast.

Discussing freedom of speech, he said, "We are a people who cherish this right, but yet we have banned its use to certain groups, including the Communists."

## County, Schools Seek to Increase Refunds to Area

A plan which would alter the formula giving outside rural communities a larger share of state tax monies is still being backed by Oakland County Board of Supervisors Chairman Delos Hamlin.

COUNTIES and school districts in the Detroit area are urging the retention tax plan. They want to keep 100 percent of the state tax increase in the heavily-populated metropolitan area where the taxes are paid.

CURRENTLY a state sales tax amendment has been introduced in the house of representatives, calling for a four- and one-half cent increase in the half-cent to be retained by counties and schools for their own use.

## Democrats to Hold Convention April 6 \$100,000 Fund For Townships Roads Is OK'd

Oakland county's townships will get a \$100,000 surplus from the county budget in 1959 if a ways and means committee recommendation is approved.

The committee of the board of supervisors, which makes county budget recommendations, approved the surplus for townships' use for special projects and emergency road repairs.

The fund transfer must be ratified by the full board of supervisors in April.

City representatives have protested the measure, claiming people in the cities would be paying most of the \$100,000, to be used by the townships.

## Vehicles Tabulated

Annual motor registration figures issued this week by James H. Hare, Secretary of State, showed 312,218 motor vehicles of all types were registered in Oakland County on which \$5,013,508.62 in taxes were collected. These included 238,103 passenger cars and 34,845 trucks and commercial vehicles.
