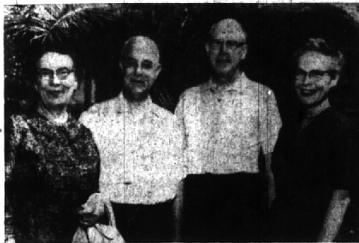
**Nurses Celebrate 25th Anniversary**

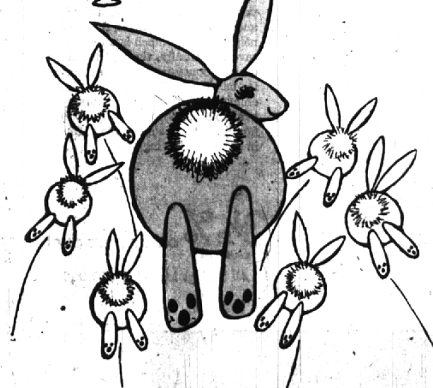
