CON EKKENS, program secretary, is going to spend a week at Camp Ohiyessa during this period as well. He will be doing all of the things the boys are doing and will welcome the chance to help out where he can.

Perhaps the feature of this period which has not been mentioned except by inference is the opportunity for boys who already have made friendships to expand those relationships within the framework of the camp program.
