

An SOS Is Out At Baldwin Public Library

Shopping bags will be the style at Baldwin Public Library tomorrow when the library launches Operation S O S ("Store Our Shopping Bags").

According to Miss Jeanne Lloyd, librarian, Operation S O S has been chosen as a means of having library shelves of as many books as possible during the coming remodeling program, to eliminate costly, time-consuming book storage and to simplify the job of moving the 44,000 volumes.

Operation S O S means the opportunity to borrow unlimited numbers of books for extended loan—everything except reference, rental, 7-day and 14-day books.

"JUST TAKE your pick, fill out an S O S card, and check out your books at the main desk," said Miss Lloyd. The library will even have special S O S shopping bags available to aid borrowers.

Because the boys' and girls' department will not be able to begin opening library service for about one month beginning in mid-April, Operation S O S presents an opportunity to stock up on books for the children of the family—both for school work and for leisure reading.

Boys and girls who wish to become Operation S O S helpers can take home juvenile S O S cards, so that their parents may indicate their permission as well as the number of books they desire to borrow on special S O S loan.

The cards are being distributed through Birmingham schools. This permission card should be presented to the child when he signs out his S O S books.

Children's books are due back between June 1 and 7, adult S O S books, between July 15 and 30.

Lots of Toll-less Miles in Michigan

LANSING—Michigan has more miles of toll-free expressway open traffic on the national interstate system than any other state in the Northeastern United States, the national highway users conference reported recently.

At this time, the report shows Michigan has more mileage on the interstate system that is "fully adequate for 1975 traffic" than any other state in the U.S. with the exception of Texas.

The report said Michigan had 285 miles of interstate expressway open to traffic at the end of 1959, following the completion of about 30 miles during December.

In addition, Michigan has approximately 100 additional miles of expressway that is not on the interstate system, for a total of 385 miles of expressway open to traffic.

People's Column Others Share Credit, Too Says Teacher

To the Editor: Whoever furnished the facts for your story last week (March 24) must have had access to the secret files. He didn't miss much!

Because it is a theory of mine that no one in our business—publications—ever wins any honors alone, I am writing you to give credit where credit is due. In earning the Columbia University Scholastic Press Association Gold Key Award and Life Membership in the Columbia Press Advisers' Association, I had much excellent help over many years.

IN BIRMINGHAM I have had wonderful students—the kind that gravitate to work on publications; I have also had the incomparable advantage of an interested, informed administration and a constructive, co-operative faculty, to say nothing of a tight-knit community in which to work.

The Eccentric, too, has contributed: It was our only outlet into print in our newspaperless years. I must share any credit that has accrued to me and am only sorry that equivalent honors cannot be conferred upon individuals, staffs and other groups that have so substantially supported our high school publications in every way.

MAY I SAY that the Highlander, our school newspaper, is equally deserving of honors, though the Piper, our yearbook, is older and seems better known locally, though nationally The Highlander equals its reputation. The Birmingham High School Highlander won the Columbia SFA first place awards not only in 1954 and 1958. It also won last year, 1959.

The Clinton Drive it spearheaded nationally won the National Education Association's Citizenship Award, to say nothing of landing 500 high schools in all 50 states in making contributions, financial and intangible, with the staff appearing on John Daly's TV News program and on Monitor.

THE HIGHLANDER and adviser article in The Offset Newspaper (in The School Press Review, Columbia SFA magazine) furnished material and photographs for the new edition of Modern Journalism, a textbook by Carl G. Miller, Spokane, Washington.

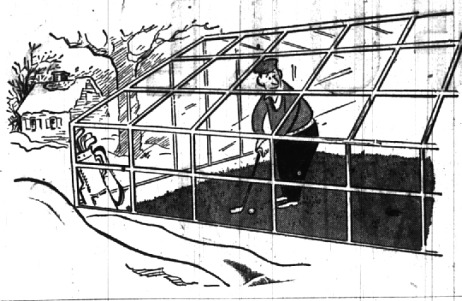

Phillip Steinhaus, newly-named organist at Kirk in the Hills, Bloomfield Hills, will give his first organ recital at the Kirk at 4 p.m. April 3.

Steinhaus, who performed last month as guest organist at the famous Old North church in Boston, has selected a varied program of organ works for his premiere recital at the Kirk.

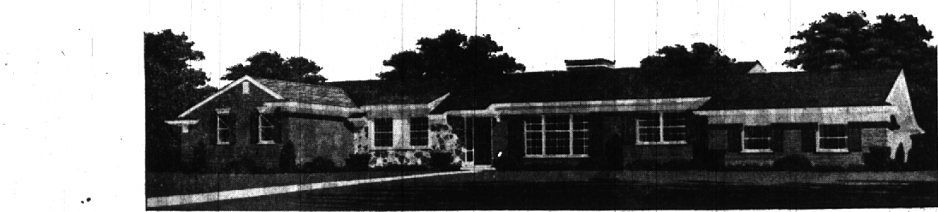

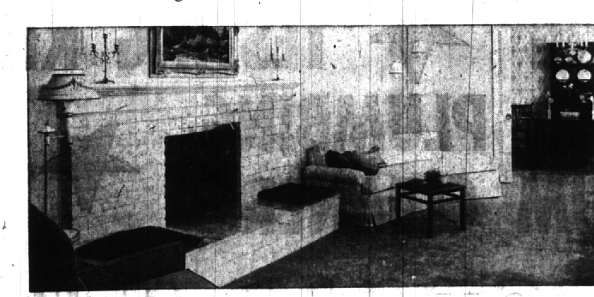
