PROPOSAL NO. 1

Sale of Property

Shall the City of Birmingham sell land owned by it described as Lots 29, 30, 31, 36, 37 and 38 of East Maple Gardens?

PROPOSAL NO. 2

CHARTER AMENDMENT A—Appointing of Constable and Designation of Judges
Shall Chapter III, Section 9; and Chapter IV, Section 12 of the charter of the City of Birmingham, State of Michigan, be amended to provide that the office of constable shall be an appointive position, rather than elective, as it is presently, and to make a change in the official ballot to delete the office of constable therefrom and to change the designations "Justice of the Peace" and "Associate Justice of the Peace" to "Municipal Judge" and "Associate Municipal Judge"?

PROPOSAL NO. 3

CHARTER AMENDMENT B—Resident Requirement for Elected Officials
Shall Chapter IV of the charter of the City of Birmingham, State of Michigan, be amended to add a new Section 25 to impose a two-year Birmingham residence requirement upon all elected officials?

PROPOSAL NO. 4

CHARTER AMENDMENT C—Library Board Vacancies
Shall Section 27 of Chapter III of the charter of the City of Birmingham, State of Michigan be amended to make clear that the commission does not make appointments to fill vacancies on the library board, since another provision of the charter gives that authority to the library board?

'Showboat's' Around Bend

Rehearsals are now under way for the Junior Variety show to be presented April 11, with a modern version of the "Showboat" theme.

B'ham Library Has Its Week and Its Work

As Baldwin Public Library observes National Library week (April 3-10) this year, it will be to the tune of the workman's saw and hammer.

Miss Jeanne Lloyd, librarian, reported that work is progressing rapidly, despite the weather, and it won't be long before the major phase of the remodeling project will be under way.

INITIAL WORK involved erection of the new wing. A portion of it will be occupied by the Library's Catalog Department in a few weeks. Workmen are transferring the second floor conference room in the original building, into library offices.

Those changes began to be keenly felt a few weeks ago when the John Watling room was closed, and all fine arts books moved into the reference department.

Now, as the workmen move into other departments of the first floor, the big project is going to affect library patrons and staff.

LARGE NUMBERS of the library's 65,000 volumes will require storage space, hence the importance of Operation SOS (Store Our Stories) revamping process.

It won't be long before those wishing to borrow magazines will feel the direct effects of the building's revamping process. No magazines will circulate after April 16, permitting them to be placed in storage until the new magazine storage facilities are completed.

WORK WILL begin on the job of turning the present children's department into a new and larger reference room about April 2.

A temporary partition will be built, cutting off that area, and the Boys' and Girls' Department will take up temporary headquarters in the present storyland alcove, which children and parents will enter from the Chester street entrance.

For the following month, in this small room, service will be available during the day, but the department will be entirely closed during the evening hours.
