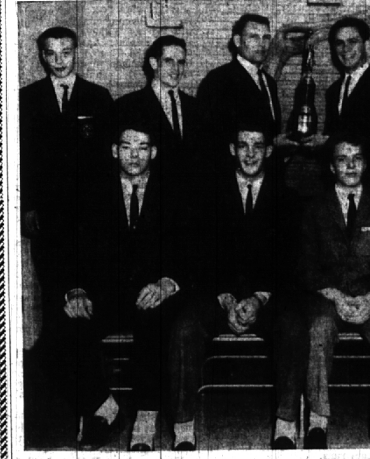

Line coach Bob Holloway spoke on "line blocking rules and line techniques."

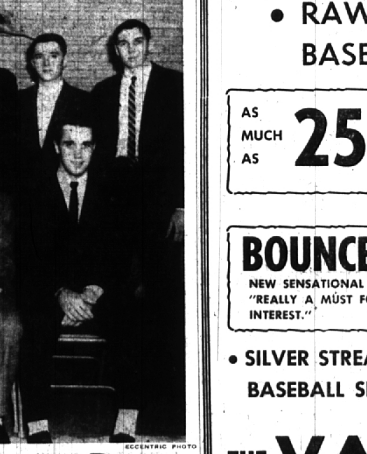
"BACKFIELD TECHNIQUES" were handled by Hank Fonde, and Jack Nelson gave a brief explanation of the various responsibilities of an end.

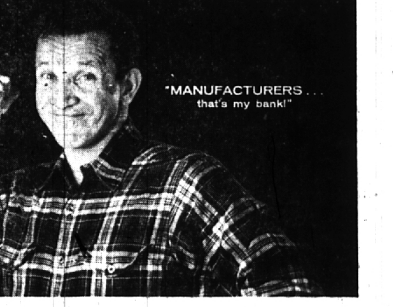
