Southfield News Briefs S'field Okays \$1 Million For Projects

SOUTHFIELD — Assessment rolls involving 24 streets and paying projects were approved by the Southfield city council last week. The projects cost approximately one million dollars.

WATER MAIN PROJECTS in the Shawwassee-8 mile-Beche area will cost \$28,562 per acre, lots \$1,822. 47-43, West Southfield, 10 lots, \$11,422. Lahser to Evergreen \$18,664 per acre, lots \$2,967. Farmbrook, \$3,012. Willow Valley \$7,422. Telegraph-9 Mile to Gardner \$11,588. Lahser-Merino crest, \$3,722. Kenway meadows \$3,562. Southfield Gardens \$5,233 based on 100 sq. ft. Miller court \$28,900 per lot and Green Valley \$6,680 per lot.

Paving will be done on Evergreen road from 1 1/2 to 12 Mile, costing \$22,424 per front foot with the total costing \$55,770. Brentwood will also be paved at \$10,277 per front foot.

Rezoned Property For Multi-Level Research Office

SOUTHFIELD — Land at the Southwest corner of 10 1/2 Mile road and Northwestern was rezoned from R-2 residential to R10 at last week's meeting of the Southfield city council. The action will permit the S. Sterling company, 18130 McNichols, to build a multi-level research office building and saleroom for electronic equipment.

The Sterling company will build a 15,000 square foot building late this year with two additional buildings of 12,000 feet each at a later date. Buffer strips for adjoining residential areas are planned as well as landscaping and ample parking facilities. Eighteen residents in the Murphy's Orchard approved the proposal.

Neighbors to Lawrence Tech and Bendix were cited as reasons that induced the company to locate in Southfield. They manufacture high-frequency radio equipment.

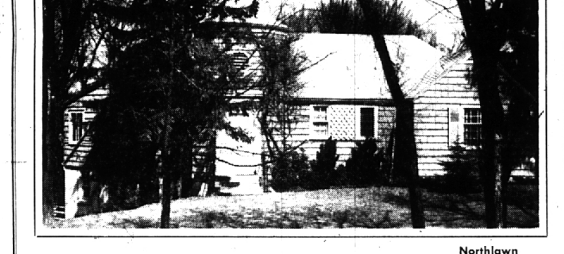

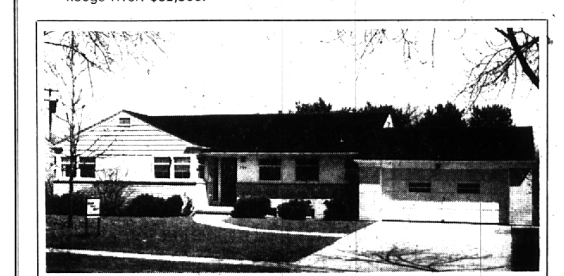
