Eye Plans For Widening S'field Road

SOUTHFIELD — To handle increased traffic from the Southfield expressway, Southfield road may be widened from two to five lanes between Nine and 13 Mile roads. Southfield officials approved the widening Monday but Lathrup has granted only tentative approval. The road commission must still give a final okay.

THE COUNTY WOULD handle construction, estimated at \$600,000 for widening from Nine Mile, north end of the expressway to 12 Mile, north boundary of Lathrup. Southfield wants widening all the way to 13 Mile, north boundary of the city.
