underwater diving look for these three points: Will the equipment benefit my safety in the water? Will it aid my underwater adventure without endangering my life? Is it necessary.

Once you have the equipment, test it and become completely familiar with it in water not more than shoulder deep and with a "buddy."

Always remember to inspect your equipment before you enter into the water and upon leaving the water wash all the equipment in fresh water. This is true even if you have been swimming in fresh water.

BODY OILS ON the rubber hoses, etc., can cause a weak-ening in the construction, as can saliva, which is more destructive than salt water. After you have done all these things, go ahead and enjoy the thrill of your life, down under.

Section 1.01. That Section 24 h. (1) of Section 27 of Ordinance No. 4 entitled "An Ordinance to Provide for the Regulation and Use of Streets and Highways: To Provide for the Regulation of Motor Vehicles and Other Vehicles; To Provide for Pedestrian Rights and Duties; To Define Duties where Accidents Occur; To Provide Administration; And to Provide Penalties for Violation of any of the Provisions of this Ordinance' be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 24 h. (1). Whenever a vehicle is lawfully parked on a street and there is sufficient natural or artificial light to reveal any person within a distance of 500 feet upon such street, no lights need be displayed upon such parked vehicle."

 $\mathbf{a}.$ No person shall park a vehicle upon any street for the principal purpose of:

(2) Washing, polishing, greasing, or repairing such vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency; (3) Displaying advertising;

(4) Selling merchandise from such vehicle except on a duly established market place, or when so authorized or licensed under the ordinances of this municipality;

(5) Storage for more than forty-eight continuous

No person shall park a commercial vehicle upon street between the hours of 8 o'clock P.M. and 4 clock A.M. for longer than a 30 minute period.

(1) The term "commercial vehicle" shall include all motor vehicles used for the transportation of passengers for hire or constructed or used for the transportation of goods, wares or merchandise, and/or all motor vehicles designed and used for drawing other vehicles and not so constructed as to carry any load thereon either independently or any part of the weight of a a vehicle or load so drawn.

Section 3.01. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and shall become effective immediately upon publication.
