**Episcopal Bishop
Of Japan to Talk
At Christ Church**

The Rt. Rev. David Makoto Goto, Episcopal Bishop of Tokyo, Japan, will speak at Christ Church Cranbrook May 12 at 8 p.m. His topic will be the work of the church in Japan.

Attending will be members of Christ Church Cranbrook and its three missions, Nativity Episcopal church, St. Stephen's Episcopal church and Church of the Advent. Interested persons from other area parishes are invited to attend the service.

BISHOP GOTO was consecrated in the Nippon Seikokoku in November, 1959. His father was the rector of Shimai church, Tokyo.

The author of numerous articles, Bishop Goto has written two books, "A History of Early Church" and "Christian Ethics." He has translated six books from English into Japanese.

The Bishop is married and has three children.

**Kirk in the Hills to Dedicate
World's Largest Carillon**

Formal dedication of the largest cast bell carillon in the world will take place May 15 at the Kirk in the Hills.

The Rev. Harold C. DeWint, pastor of the Bloomfield Hills church, will officiate at special dedicatory ceremonies at both the 9:30 and 11:30 a.m. services.

At 4 p.m., a dedicatory recital will be played by Professor Wendell Westcott, carillonist at Michigan State University.

The 77-bell carillon, ranked as the world's largest in total number of bells, was manufactured by Petit & Fritsen, Ltd., of Aarle-Rixtel, Holland. Gerald Fritsen, whose family has been fashioning bells in the great father-son tradition for three centuries, supervised the installation. The bells took nearly a year to manufacture and three months to install in the Kirk tower.

WEIGHING A TOTAL of 68,000 pounds, the cast bronze bells are suspended in eight rows on a massive steel framework set within the tower, which soars nearly 200 feet to the top of its spire.

The largest, or "bourdon", bell

Kirk, can play 32 of the bells from an electrified keyboard located at the organ console in the West Ambulatory of the church. To conduct the full 77-bell carillon, however, he climbs to a cabin mounted midway up the tower and rings the bells by striking wooden levers with his hands and feet.

FIVE BELLS PEAL, swinging back and forth on bearings, and sounding the notes G, B, D, E and G. The rest are mechanically actuated by clappers, and all are finely tuned to exact pitches which were checked at the foundry and double-checked after installation.

AN AUTOMATIC striking device will operate the carillon from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily. The bourdon bell will toll the hours, and the Bell Motive from Richard Wagner's "Parsifal" will ring at the quarter hours.
