Admission is fifty cents. Money collected will support next year's band and orchestra.

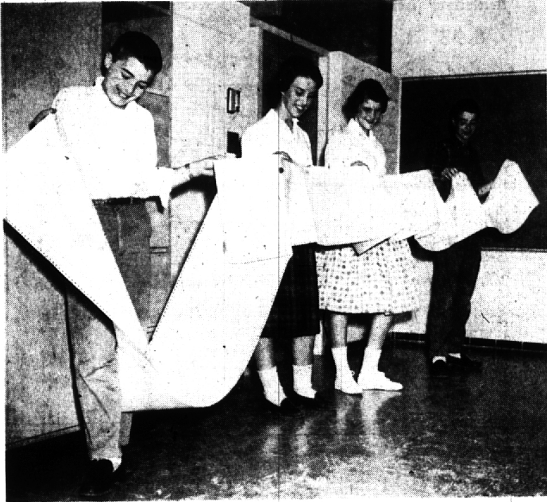
## Needed No Channel For 'Aquavision' —They Had a Pool

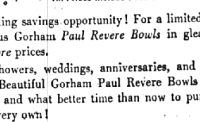

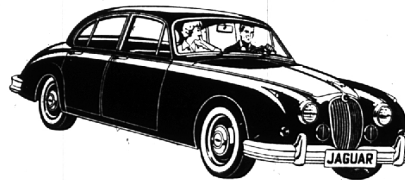

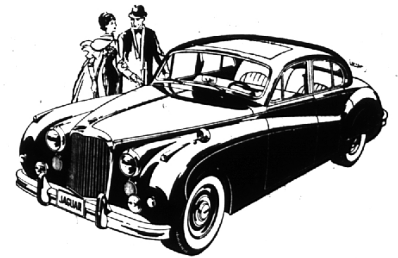
