Franklin Council Approves Budget, Rejects Bids

FRANKLIN — "No comment" sums up the public hearing on the \$87,700 fiscal budget Monday as the council adopted it and the \$4 mill tax. Councilman J. Robert Mitchell was the only dissenter. Since the only bid came from one company and was in excess of the \$5,000 allocated in the budget for the three treatments, the council agreed to solicit other bids.
