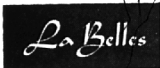

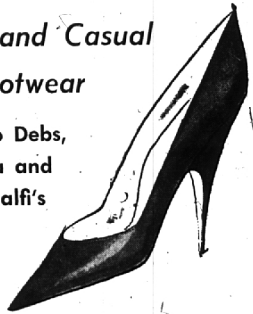

the regents established this method of honoring distinguished citizens and friends of the university in 1931. He has been active in U-M affairs, serving as a non-resident instructor teaching courses in trust functions in the school of business administration, and on committees which organized two annual events at the U-M, the Bank Study conference of the Michigan bankers association and the MBA's summer school program.

Gardner, who resides at 172 Aspen, Birmingham, was formerly director and president of The Birmingham National bank and chairman of the board and president of the Feredale National bank. Both institutions became part of The Detroit Bank & Trust company through a 1956 merger.

A PAST president of the Michigan bankers association and the Detroit chapter, American institute of banking, he has also served on the executive councils of both groups.

For 20 years, Gardner served as an instructor for the Detroit chapter, American institute of banking, on the subjects of bank organization and administration, and elementary and applied economics.

He has been a trustee of Kalamazoo college, Kalamazoo, for the past 20 years. He is also a member and treasurer of the board of trustees of Cranbrook, Kingwood and Brookside schools in Bloomfield Hills.

GARDNER is trustee and treasurer of the Michigan foundation for medical and health education.

For 15 years, he served as chairman of the board of management of the Northern branch, Detroit YMCA. Since 1944, he has been citizen's representative on the board of trustees of the Birmingham employees retirement board. Gardner, a native of Detroit, holds an LL.B. degree from the Detroit College of Law. He is a director of Flores, Inc.; Torrence Oil company, Inc. and Detrex Chemical Industries, Inc.

Rek Director Anticipates Big Surplus

The Birmingham recreation director Don Martin presented a budget status report as of April 30, 1960, showing an anticipated surplus of \$7,618.10 by the end of the budget year (June). Martin also suggested a procedure for handling revenue of self-supporting activities that fall in two budget years. The revenue collected during May and June for certain summer activities should be kept in a separate account and drawn upon as expenses increase throughout the summer season.

CHARLES GALE, superintendent of parks and forests and Martin reported that a Boy Scout troop in the Quarton School area wished to donate approximately \$100 for two sets of four-row steel bleachers.

The Recreation board members moved that an additional amount not to exceed \$100 be appropriated to purchase two sections of five-row, mobile units subject to the group turning the units over to the city for other recreation needs when not in use at Quarton school.

been installed at Groves high school—can save as much as one-third in operational costs, according to state estimates, he said.

The range program allows one teacher to direct six cars at one time, Nesbitt pointed out. The street method necessitates the employment of one teacher in each car.

The matter is due for further study by the board.

THE BOARD also okayed the taking of bids on a "carry-all" small panel truck that doubles as a bus.

The vehicle would be used to help transport the 38 children who must be taken to particular schools for special training. It would also enable the school district to transport another 17 children who are eligible for special training at schools in other districts.
