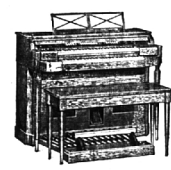
Pembroke School Receives Tree From Blue Birds

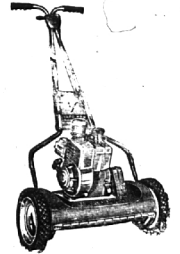
