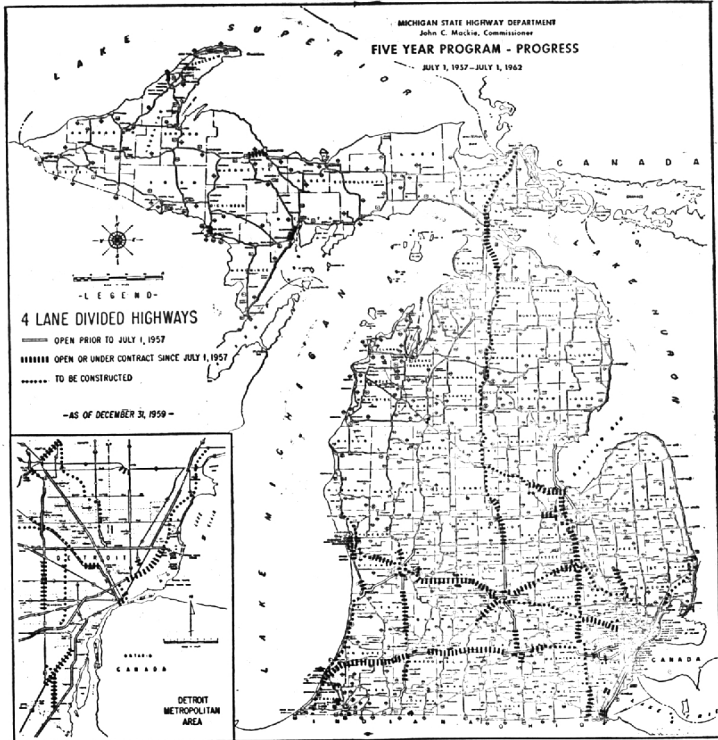

FIVE-YEAR ROADBUILDING PROGRAM ON SCHEDULE



Michigan's five-year, one billion 250 million dollar highway construction is on schedule at the midway mark, according to State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie.

During the first two and one-half years—from July 1, 1957 to Dec. 31, 1959—some 419 miles of divided four-lane highway was opened to traffic and another 160 miles is now under contract.

In addition, nearly 1,000 miles of two-lane highway was modernized and the amount of gravel road mileage on the state trunkline system was reduced from 800 to 454 miles.

Final sections of the state's three major expressways—Detroit to Chicago, Detroit to Muskegon and Ohio line to Sault Ste. Marie—were scheduled to be placed under contract during final phase of the five-year program.

What's in a Name? Plenty in 'Huron'!

ANN ARBOR—The story of a strange Indian hair style and how it led to the naming of two rivers, a lake, village, country, and mountain range in Michigan is told on the University Broadcasting Service (WJOM) program, "A Treasury of Michigan Names."

The name "Huron" was given to an Indian tribe by early French explorers who used it to describe the head of a wild boar.

Champlain found them in 1603 along Georgian Bay in Canada. He agreed to help the Hurons fight the Iroquois, believing the Iroquois were supported by the Dutch in the battle for the valuable fur trade.

AN IROQUOIS war party forced the Hurons to flee into Northern Michigan beyond Sault Ste. Marie and into Ohio in 1648. Here they helped the French fight the British and were defeated. After signing a peace treaty with Great Britain, the Hurons found themselves again on the losing side of the American Revolution.

With the immigration of white settlers, the Hurons were forced to move again, this time west of the Mississippi River. Today their lands are in Kansas.
