Bridge Tables To Community House

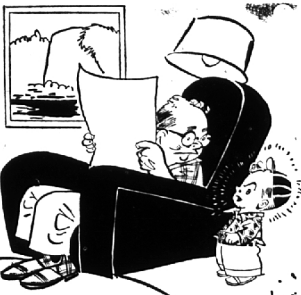

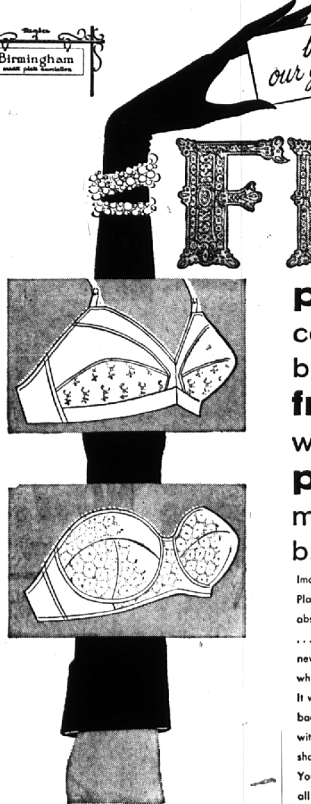

QUESTION OF THE WEEK: Is it all right to plant other flowers in rose beds?

BOB'S ANSWER:

Other flowers may be planted as ground cover in rose beds but they should be plants which won't take too much of the food the roses need. Some examples are sweet alyssum, pansies, petunias, annual phlox, lobelia, verbena, and Johnny-jump-up. Call us for planting directions if you wish.
