now. ROSE CHAFER:—These long-legged beetles will soon be here again. The grubs are feeding now—on the roots of grass and plants and will emerge when grapes bloom. Then they are really hungry. Follow this two-step program and for best results GET term submore group CoOPED VIS.

YOUR NEIGHBORS TO COOPERATE :--

Kill grubs by distributing 4 oz. of actual chlorhane (2 lbs. of 10% grandular, or 4 oz. of 72% liquid) or 8 oz. of dieldrin to each 1000 sq. ft. of lawn and garden.

Kill the beetles by spraying the plants with Mc.B Insect Spray, Isotox or with a mixture of 2 table-spoorfuls of 50°, DDT, or 20°, DDT Emulsion (DD-IDE) with 2 tesspoonfuls of 50°; malathion to a gal, of water. Spray as needed. (Do not spray DDT on privet, bleeding heart, delphinium or honeysuckle).

honeysuckie). FRUTP FESTS:--There is no use to own good fruit trees and have poor fruit. Wormy and diseased fruits create a mess on the ground. Good fruit is picked and enjoyed and the mess is eliminated. Proper pruning, fertilizing and spraying constitute the program. Right now we will talk about spraying.
