matters we feel should be brought to your attention now.

**ROSE CHAFER:**—These long-legged beetles will soon be here again. The grubs are feeding now—on the roots of grass and plants and will emerge when grapes bloom. Then they are really hungry.

Follow this two-step program and for best results GET YOUR NEIGHBORS TO COOPERATE:—

1. Kill grubs by distributing 4 oz. of actual chlordane (2 lbs. of 10% granular, or 4 oz. of 72% liquid) or 8 oz. of dieldrin to each 1000 sq. ft. of lawn and garden.
2. Kill the beetles by spraying the plants with Mc-B Insect Spray, Isotox or with a mixture of 2 table-spoonsfuls of 50% DDT, or 20% of DDT Emulsion (DD-IDE) with 2 teaspoonfuls of 50% malathion to a gal. of water. Spray as needed. (Do not spray DDT on privet, bleeding heart, delphinium or honeysuckle).

**FRUIT PESTS:**—There is no use to own good fruit trees and have poor fruit. Wormy and diseased fruits create a mess on the ground. Good fruit is picked and enjoyed and the mess is eliminated.

Proper pruning, fertilizing and spraying constitute the program. Right now we will talk about spraying.

An outstanding formula contains malathion, methoxychlor and captan—is called the Michigan Formula—and is available under the private label name of McClellan-Ball Fruit Tree Spray.

Spray once a week (not during blossom time) to within one week of harvest.

Thoroughly wet all the foliage. Don't do a half baked job.

Too much fruit on a tree prevents the development of full size fruits—so hand thinning on small trees is desirable. Twist off the excess fruits—do not pull them off.

Thinning sprays can be used if the trees are in bloom.

**DOWN TO EARTH**  
**Viburnums Popular**  
**Family of Shrubs**

May I introduce you to the Viburnum family. If you want a type of shrub with "the mostest," plan on grouping these fine specimens in groups of three or five. Most members of the family have beautiful flowers, lush berries and an interesting coloring in the fall.

After all I have been trying to tutor you to be interested in "planting pictures" which will have a four season interest.

**Viburnum Caroleophalum** will be seven feet high with heavily scented white gobs of flowers. The foliage is a brilliant red in autumn. This plant of the Viburnum family receives the most votes on my list.

**Viburnum Burkwoodii** will take half shade and reward you with a soft pink snowball-like flowers on its six foot shrub.

**VIBURNUM** To mention a second one in the score with many many white flowers in the garden which grow on the branches so that they look like saucers placed on them in a horizontal fashion. It will grow eight feet high and be six feet in diameter at maturity. Viburnum Opulus nanum will only grow two feet high and is good placed as a hedge under a low picture window in a sunny location. It can be clipped and will become very compact. If it becomes "bushy" just hose it with a strong stream of water.

**VIBURNUM OPULUS** Xanthocarpum has golden fruit in the Fall as its greatest asset. It will grow seven feet high in the sun.

**Viburnum Setigerum** has great quantities of bright red berries. Plan on it growing ten feet high with a diameter of six feet.

Remember that this shrub has an unfavorable reaction to the regular sprays you use on roses which contain sulphur and if it is a windy day when you do any spraying it will affect the leaves of the Viburnum causing them to fall off.

**FOR THE FIRST** time in the history of American Gardening the board of experts from the Brooklyn Botanic gardens have selected the 100 finest trees and shrubs for the home grounds in temperate climates. The director of the Botanical Gardens, Dr. George Avery, Jr., calls this selection the "Memorandum" for devoted gardeners.

Each plant in the selection was chosen because of the beauty of foliage, flower and fruit, easy to grow, relatively free from pests, and they will give interest more than one season of the year. This selection is described for gardeners in their handbook, "The Hundred Finest Trees and Shrubs For Temperate Climates." Brooklyn Botanic Gardens, Brooklyn, N. Y. This is another of their one-dollar booklets printed as a public service by this institution. The eighty page book is filled with descriptive pictures.

**IN THIS AREA** we have many rose fanciers. You may wish to join the H. E. rose gardeners in the country and become affiliated with the American Rose Society with headquarters in Columbus, Ohio. The large Park of Roses in Columbus, Ohio, where the headquarters of the American Rose society is located is always an important stop for your writer when she is in southern Ohio. Words cannot describe the acres of beauty as you see thousands of roses, labeled and cared for by masters.

**IF YOU HAVE** an apple tree which is an alternate-year bearing tree, you can bring it into an annual bearing schedule by using the hormone spray, naphthalacetimide, twenty eye drops to a quart of water. Apply this spray four weeks after full bloom in the heavy bearing year. Good luck mixing Nature up.
